In June of 1997, ten United Methodist churches in San Antonio, Texas established the Hispanic Religious Partnership for Community, a network serving the needs of San Antonio's underserved. In 2013, the board renamed Texas Diaper Bank to reflect its mission to address the diaper gap. Today, the organization is the first and largest diaper bank in the state of Texas, leading the charge in tackling overlooked public health issues and uniquely addressing 3 neglected public health concerns: the diaper gap, the incontinence gap, and period poverty through the distribution of millions of healthcare essentials each year.

Our mission to address the diaper gap and its impact on individuals in crisis is rooted in the belief that essential healthcare product access is a fundamental right- not a privilege. For nearly three decades, we have worked to change the health disparities that affect hundreds of thousands of Texas families' opportunities to lead happy, healthy, and successful lives

Our commitment to serving the community goes beyond just providing diapers. We strive to make a difference by addressing the broader spectrum of healthcare essentials that are often overlooked. By recognizing and catering to the needs of those facing the diaper gap, incontinence gap, and period poverty, we aim to enhance the well-being and dignity of individuals in crisis.

Through our efforts, we advocate for equal access to essential healthcare products, believing that it is a basic right that should be available to all, regardless of their circumstances. By distributing millions of healthcare essentials each year, we are not just offering physical support but also hope and empowerment to families in need.

Calm Parent Classes

When parents experiencing poverty do not have the resources required to provide for the basic needs of their children, they often suffer from feelings of inadequacy that gravely affect their mental well-being, a key social determinant of health. TXDB addresses this through Calm Parent, a series of educational courses that provide materials, goods, and training around early childhood milestones.

Disaster Relief

Every little bit of help can make a difference in times of crisis. TXDB's Disaster Relief program provides essential nonperishable items to those in need when emergencies strike unexpectedly. While many resources are available for disaster relief, one often-overlooked necessity is diapers. Surprisingly, international disaster relief efforts typically do not include provisions for diapers.

Recognizing this crucial gap, TXDB has taken the lead in addressing this issue and ensuring that communities affected by disasters can access this often overlooked but essential item. By providing immediate relief in the form of diapers and other nonperishable goods, TXDB is positively impacting the lives of those in need during challenging times.

Through this program, TXDB was able to provide emergency assistance to/for:

- Individuals affected by the crisis in Uvalde
- Mass distributions to the entire San Antonio community
- Individuals effected by personal crisis
- Many other organizations and causes as needed

Our Work in the Community

Last year, our CEO, Jorge Medina, collaborated with similar organizations and individuals to support the approval of Texas Senate Law, SB379. This law, endorsed by Governor Greg Abbott on June 16, 2023, and effective from September 1, 2023, successfully eliminated sales tax on various essential items including diapers for adults and children, wipes, baby bottles, maternity clothing, breast pumps, and feminine hygiene products.

During an interview with KSAT, our CEO expressed, "For many families, who do not have the financial or economic means to purchase the necessary amount of diapers, any money that we can put back in their pocket is something that's great. Removing the sales tax is just another step in increasing accessibility and removing barriers for items people simply cannot live without."

Through his advocacy and the collective efforts of others across the state, a meaningful impact has been made on the well-being of some of Texas's most vulnerable communities. This marks just the beginning of a series of initiatives aimed at enhancing the quality of life for families, women, and seniors in Texas.

Our CEO's dedication to advocating for the approval of Texas Senate Law, SB379, highlights his commitment to supporting families in need. The elimination of sales tax on essential items such as diapers, wipes, and feminine hygiene products has already begun to positively impact the lives of many individuals across the state.

By collaborating with like-minded organizations and individuals, Jorge Medina has shown that positive change can be achieved through collective efforts.
